## **Reflection | When the World Feels Unsteady**

In the absence of Pastor Angie this month, these words come from our Office Administrator – offered with care, humility, and deep love for this community.

Some days it feels like the world is holding its breath.

The news carries so much – war and violence, division and fear, grief layered upon grief. It can feel overwhelming, even disorienting, as though the ground beneath us is less steady than it once was. Many of us are carrying not only the weight of global events, but also personal worries and quiet struggles that never make the headlines.

As a church rooted in faith and witness, we do not pretend that brokenness is new – or that faith shields us from it. Our faith is a tradition that tells the truth: the world is fractured, and so are we. And still, we trust in a God who meets us not in perfection, but in grace.

We gather week after week around Word and Sacrament, not because everything is resolved, but because God promises to show up right in the midst of unresolved things.

We believe that Christ is present in ordinary places – in shared prayers, in familiar hymns, in conversations over coffee, in acts of quiet care that rarely draw attention.

Hope, for us, is not denial or naive optimism. It is resurrection hope. It is the steady conviction that God is still at work, even when the news tells us otherwise. It is the freedom to serve our neighbors, seek justice, and care for creation – not because we can fix everything, but because love is still our calling.

In a time when so much feels uncertain, I am grateful for a community that continues to show up for one another with compassion, honesty, and grace. May we keep holding space for lament and for trust, for questions and for faith, confident that God walks with us through all of it.

Even now. Even here.

### CROSS STITCHING A LENTEN JOURNEY – Windows to Wonder



### Faithfulness amidst Changes

I am so thankful for the faithfulness you have shared with me as people and congregations who support my work as an ELCA global missionary. I have served in three different countries since becoming an ELCA missionary (Senegal, Zambia, Madagascar). As of September 2025, my work shifted once again. I continue to live in Madagascar, but I am now the ELCA Regional Representative for Madagascar and English speaking West Africa (Nigeria, Ghana, Liberia, Guinea, and Sierra Leone).

Since starting my new call, I am often asked what it means to be an ELCA Regional Representative. The best response I've found is that I am a bridge in the relationship between the ELCA and our global companions.

In the ELCA, relationships are the basis for mission. While we can be in relationship through email or online meetings, it is also important to be together, in person. To pray, to eat, to talk together. Just as God came to be with us, in person—in Jesus Christ. As the ELCA Regional Representative, I visit and participate in important events in our companion churches. I also give a lot of speeches, listen in a lot of meetings, and pray often with others.

Another part of my role is to facilitate grants our companions receive from the ELCA. During my visits, I make sure to visit communities and church workers who lead grant supported projects. Then, I can share with you, as members of the ELCA, the good work of God we are doing together.
